This week we acknowledged Mental Health Week with a series of Mindfulness based classes for students from Yogazeit. This year the theme for Mental Health Week was Strengthening Our Community - Live, Work, Play, with the aim of increasing mental wellbeing in WA communities. The events of recent times have brought the social determinants of mental health into sharp focus, so it's important to be aware and safeguard these factors of mental health, both during and after the COVID-19 pandemic has passed.

Mindfulness is the ability to be fully present in the moment without judgement or distraction. Students began each class with techniques to focus on their mindfulness in complete silence, and then were asked to focus on a reoccuring sound made by the instructor. Students were then shown a series of simple yoga moves, which they practised with the instructor, then on their own.

### **Geography Excursion to Fremantle**

Year 11 General Geography students have been studying the potential and impact of tourism to a region, regarding its natural and cultural characteristics and its sustainability, with an excursion to Fremantle. Seventeen students accompanied by Miss McCathie, Miss Bajada and Mrs Towers left Canning Vale College for Fremantle, their first stop being Fremantle Prison, where they could apply their acquired knowledge. At the prison, our guide Courtney helped us discover the history of Fremantle Prison from its construction in the 1850s until the end of the convict era in 1886. We found out why almost 10,000 men were transported from Great Britain and Ireland, how they built their own prison and helped shape the future of Western Australia. We visited the cells, metal works yard, prison garden, exercise yard and the flogging post. From there we walked past the Fremantle Oval, Fremantle markets, backpackers, Esplanade hotel, Esplanade reserve and Notre Dame University whilst noting down transport options, eateries, types of tourism and how sustainable the tourism activity is to Fremantle.

We had a delicious lunch at Cicerellos and made our way to the Round House. The Roundhouse is the oldest public building in the State of Western Australia. Opened in January 1831, just 18 months after settlement, it was built to hold any person convicted of a crime in the settlement and was used until 1886. After it ceased being used as a gaol it became a Police Lock-up until the late 1890s and then was used as accommodation for the Water Police, and afterwards as a storage facility for Fremantle Ports. When threatened with demolition in the 1920s it was saved, and later control went to the State Government before it was deeded to the City of Fremantle. At 1pm we were present for the firing of the canon. An enjoyable, fun day was had by all, maybe a little tired from all the walking though. The weather was glorious, the sun was shining and the sea breeze was in to cool us down. The students' behavior was exceptional; they showed respect at the highest level and did themselves and the school proud. Fremantle is colonial history by the beach so come and visit for yourself sometime.


# Students Complete Certificate II in Building and Construction

The program was an intensive week of learning web design with HTML/CSS, Javascript and hardware programming with micro:bits.

Janeeta worked in groups, in pairs and individually across these areas. She Codes is about teaching women coding skills, getting women into technical careers and building communities of like-minded women. #### Sean Awarded a Certificate II in Civil Construction

Congratulations to Sean Coetzee who recently graduated from Motivation Foundation (Ertech Construction Academy) with a Certificate II in Civil Construction. The Year 9 boys also finished the day on top, winning all games and defeating Butler by two straight sets in the Grand Final. ### **Local Primary Schools Get to Experience High School**

Students from local primary schools are taking part in our Science Outreach Program, over the next four weeks. This week the Year 5 students participated in a Biology class, where they examined dissected bones, to investigate what's inside. Students were surprised to learn the difference between red bone marrow and yellow bone marrow, and their functions within the body.

After the bones were examined, students worked in pairs to discover Euglena under the microscope. Euglena are tiny organisms from a group called Protista, and are found in pond water. They move around using a tail-like structure, which the students could see under the microscope, as they appeared to be swimming around the slide. Next week the Year 5's will experience a Chemistry class, before a STEM class to finish off the program.








## Yr 9 Earthquake Tower Challenge

Students put their design and construction skills to the test by constructing a tower to try and withstand an earthquake. Students were limited to 1 cardboard base, 50 paper straws, 40 paper clips, 20 pipecleaners and a small roll of sellotape, and could be as creative as they wanted with the shape and design.

Once constructed, each group's tower was challenged to undergo a simulated earthquake on the 'shake table', with added weights. After successfully surviving each earthquake, incremental weights were added until the tower collapsed. One group succeeded in building a tower that supported more than 4kg in addition to surviving a large earthquake.

Members of our Year 7 cohort have been busy during their spare time making red paper poppies to create a visual representation of 'In Flanders Fields'.

Members of the Student Council lowered the flags to half mast in recognition of the sacrifice of all those who have died during war.




## Amritha Addresses Patrons of the Zero2Hero Red Cape Ball

## Students Experience the Grim Reality Of The Holocaust

On Wednesday the 11th of November, the two General and ATAR Modern History classes went on an excursion to the Holocaust Institute of WA in Yokine. In correlation with the topic of Nazi Germany (and the politics involved in Hitler's reign) that the students had already been learning in class, the Holocaust Institute further explored these topics on a personal and emotional level.

Upon arrival, the students were asked to listen to a presentation of the events they had studied and to participate where required. In the midst of the presentation and discussion, the students were urged to engage in two specific activities. The introductory activity involved particular human rights that the Jews were denied of. Pieces of paper listing these human rights were put up around the room, and the students had to stand in front of the one that was most important to them and explain why they chose it.

The subsequent activity consisted of being assigned a family name and then finding the matching suitcase. In these groups of approximately 3 to 5 people, students were given the names, ages and professions of each member of the family. They were asked to write down ten items that the family would bring if they only had 10 minutes to gather their belongings. Other minor activities involved further exploring the museum and the historical photographs, clothes and books (like the original Mein Kampf written by Hitler and children's literature that was essentially a form of propaganda).

The students were also privileged in listening to a Holocaust survivor, who explained her experience and the way in which she had survived. As a whole, this experience was very valuable to the students and evoked an emotional response from the collective group. It was essentially an eye-opener to the fact that these events did affect a vast majority of people and that it will continue to live with them forever.
