Closing the Transition Gap

- Common teaching practices across the College make for a smoother transition into High School.
- Separate area for Year 7's at breaks.
- Many Year 7 support staff.
- Our Behaviour Management practices are similar to primary schools.
- We visit all our feeder primary schools at the end of the year to gain valuable insight that helps us prepare students for the transition to year 7.



You can help before school begins by:

- Practical
- Allowing your child to undertake more practical skills such as making their own lunch and breakfast, washing and ironing their own uniforms and general chores around the house.
- Social
- You can help support their resiliency by understanding that setbacks are a learning experience, that they will be required to take turns, say 'hello' and use appropriate manners
- Academic
- Ensure that they have a study area
- Encourage them to learn and use teachers' names



Curriculum Overview

- The focus of schooling in Years 7-10 is to continue to develop broad and comprehensive educational knowledge and skills.
- The Australian curriculum is year specific.
- Year 11 and 12 are specialist years.
- The Western Australian curriculum is the same at every secondary school (private and public) in the state.



Timetable

A Year 7 student's week includes 25 hours of class time per week:

- 4 hours each of : English, Maths, Science & HASS (total 16 hours)
- 2 hours of Physical Education
- 2 hours of Language (Italian or Indonesian)
- 1 hour of Health Education
- 4 hours of Technology/Arts



Specialist Programs at CVC

- A specialist program at any school is about exposing a student to a specialist teacher for a small percentage of their school work.
- A specialist program may involve hours both in and out of school class instruction.
- For the rest of their education the student is part of the regular cohort.

Student Engagement and Support

At CVC we believe the social and emotional care of your child is a team responsibility. Our Student Engagement and Support team includes:

- Youth Support officers (Yr 7-9)
- Year Coordinators (Yr 10-12)
- Associate Principal (1), Managers (2)
- Nurse, Psychologist, Chaplain



Supporting Student Needs

Curriculum delivery is supported by our Learning Support team who support students who have learning difficulties or disabilities as well as mainstream students who are not achieving the national achievement benchmarks.

The Learning Support team work with teachers in their classes or may engage separate classes for groups of students with similar needs.



The Transition Process

- Transition/Orientation Day (Week 3 Term 4)
- Youth Leader appointed to mentor Yr7 students
- Discussions with Primary School teachers
- Parents are welcome to discuss their child's individual needs with a Transition Coordinator prior to commencing with us.



Extra Curricular Activities
